As the new year gets under way we are pleased to announce an exciting series of events. Our winter tour to the John Russell Pope house on 93rd Street in Manhattan was quickly sold out. The lucky guests were treated to a real architectural gem.

Next month we are offering a glimpse of a completely different part of the country. William H. Bates III will give us a taste of classical Charleston. Mr. Bates teaches at the American College of the Building Arts in Charleston, which, a few years ago, inherited the Smithsonian's annual festival of Masters of the Building Arts. The event draws craftsmen from around the world.

How to build a house within a house is the subject of a lecture by J. Michael Kelley. In April, Mr. Kelley will discuss his dismantling of the early Dutch Daniel Winne House and his installation of it at the American Wing of the Metropolitan Museum. Mr. Kelley is the president of J. M. Kelley, Ltd., a consulting and contracting company specializing in restoration and replication of historic architecture.

Our field trip in May will take us to Ridgefield, Connecticut, where we will visit several classically inspired private houses in this historic town. The day will include lunch at the Elms Inn.

We are particularly pleased that our friends at historic Hyde Hall, in Cooperstown, New York, are arranging a wonderful two-day event for us in July. Our honorary patron, Sir Philip Thomas, KCVO, CMG, Her Majesty's Consul General, will be our guest for a dinner in his honor at Hyde Hall and at a performance of the Pirates of Penzance at the Glimmerglass Opera. Our visit will also include visits to private houses dating from the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries.



## Preservation and New Construction in Charleston, South Carolina William H. Bates III, American College of the Building Arts




Three years ago the American College of the Building Arts took over the annual festival of Masters of the Building Arts, previously held by the Smithsonian. The festival provides a forum for craftsmen from around the world such as the Scottish sculptor Alexander Stoddart and the famous Barthe family of plasterers from New Orleans.

William Bates will discuss, in general, preservation and new construction in Charleston and, specifically, how the College of Building Arts is developing a curriculum to meet the needs of craftsmen around the country. The lecture will be accompanied with illustrations.

William H. Bates III holds a masters degree in architecture from the University of Miami and is a fellow of the Institute of Classical Architecture/Classical America, where he has also taught. He teaches drawing and design at the American College of the Building Arts and lectures on architecture, preservation, antique furniture, and decorative arts.



The Daniel Winne House (1751) is an early Dutch vernacular house that has recently been installed in the American Wing of the Metropolitan Museum. Michael Kelley, a consultant and contractor to the American Wing, was responsible for documenting and dismantling the house and installing it at the museum. He will illustrate and discuss the process of moving the house, giving us an inside view of this unusual aspect of preservation.

J. Michael Kelley has worked for nearly twenty years in the field of historic preservation. His projects have included the restoration of the Hendrick Smit House (1709) in Ulster County and the creation of the Old Chatham Sheepherding Company Inn, Shaker Barn, and outbuildings in Old Chatham, New York. As a consultant at the Metropolitan he has been asked to evaluate some of the arcitectural artifacts in the American Wing and is currently moving and reconstructing some of the historic classical interiors for its redesign. Michael Kelley has been a member of the Georgian Group in England for six years and recently joined the AFGG as well.

Our lecture will be followed by a reception.
