We have just returned from a trip to Cooperstown, New York. "This is the most enjoyable experience I've had with the Georgians," one member exclaimed. The visit began with dinner on the grand wraparound porch of Auchinbreck, the seventeenth-century house of June and Kent Barwick. Thursday we were treated to a fascinating tour of Hyde Hall, an outstanding eighteenth-century mansion beautifully situated at the foot of the lake named Glimmerglass by James Fenimore Cooper. We spent the rest of the day on a walking tour through several Georgian and Georgian revival houses and returned to Hyde Hall for an elegant candlelight buffet. The distinguished Sir Michael Rose, one of the most highly decorated officers in the British army, was our guest of honor at dinner and at the later special cocktail reception during intermission at the *Pirates of Penzance*. We all felt the AFGG contribution to the restoration of a staircase at Hyde Hall had been a wonderful investment and our visit there was thoroughly delightful.

Earlier in the spring we visited charming Ridgefield, Connecticut. Our day trip included a farmhouse from 1735 and a tavern from the 1750s as well as some gorgeous revival houses and lunch at the Elms Inn. Our day trips are always popular. In October we will spend a day in Millbrook, New York. Be sure to sign up early for this lovely fall event.

Surprisingly, there remain a very few places on the October 20–25 trip to Buckinghamshire. The Georgian Group in England has planned a trip filled with visits to private houses and astonishing gardens. We will stay at magnificent Hartwell House. 




Furnishing a Folly: a History
of Garden Furniture
and Design



Landscape and garden design were important features of the Georgian world. Our first fall event will be a lecture by the distinguished John Danzer, an expert on the history of garden furniture. His company, Munder-Skiles, specializes in the design and production of historically inspired garden furniture. Educated as an art historian, John Danzer addresses decorative arts, design, and horticultural organizations on the history of garden furniture design. His second company is Exterior Decorator, for which he advises clients on appropriate furnishings for various environments. He also publishes a magazine called the World of Exteriors. His talk to us will cover a broad historical span, with a focus on the follies, chairs, and tables of the Georgian period.

Fittingly, this lecture on exteriors will be held at the Arsenal in Central Park. The Arsenal was designed by Martin E. Thompson to resemble a medieval castle and built around 1850. The lobby contains murals by WPA artist Allan Saalburg. Our lecture will be followed by a reception on the roof (weather permitting) of the Arsenal, which is at the entrance to the park at Fifth Avenue and 64th Street.

Field Trip to Millbrook, New York Saturday, October 14, 2006 Bus departs from the southeast corner of 72nd Street and Park Avenue promptly at 8:00 we will return to NYC between 7 and 8



Autumn in Hudson Valley hunt country is as picturesque as any Georgian could desire. It will make a scenic background for our exploration of the work of prominent architect and builder Nathaniel Lockwood, who was responsible for many handsome buildings in the area in the early nineteenth century. Lockwood's style was primarily Doric-order Greek Revival, inspired by contemporary pattern books. Our tour will include examples of ground-up construction, Greek Revival nineteenth-century houses, and Greek Revival nineteenth-century additions grafted on to eighteenth-century houses. At Bird House, we will be on the spot to hear the story of Lockwood's scandalous behavior. None of the houses we will visit are open to the public and all have been recently restored. We will enjoy luncheon at Stissing House, a mid-eighteenth-century inn and meeting house in Pine Plains. Before returning to the city, we will have refreshments at Bullis Hall, a Greek Revival building in Bangall, dating from 1832 and now a Relais & Châteaux grand country inn.

Space on this trip is limited and reservations will be honored in the order in which they are received. We must receive your reservation and payment by October 5. This is a full-day trip, so please plan accordingly.


