Greetings of the season to all! Many of you attended our annual meeting on December 10, which was particularly delightful this year. The meeting and our Christmas party took place at the residence of our honorary patron, Sir Alan Collins, the British Consul-General. Although Sir Alan was obliged to be in England, his lovely wife, Ann, was our hostess. The Lady Bradbury, chairman of the Georgian Group Anglo-American committee, was the honored guest. It was a gala event indeed, and we are very grateful to Sir Alan and Lady Ann for their hospitality.

Our annual trip to England is always a highlight of the season and this year's visit to Weston Park and the stately homes of Shropshire and Staffordshire was no exception. We toured the very grand Willey Park, which is surrounded by eight thousand acres, saw architecture by Francis Smith, James Gibbs, John Nash, and John Soane, and visited the Wedgwood Centre. Elegant Weston Park, where we stayed, felt like our very own stately home.

The AFGG offered a range of entertaining events in 2007 and 2008 promises to be equally exciting. First on the calendar is a return to the Winter Antiques Show, which was enthusiastically attended last winter. Our exclusive visit will include luncheon in the historic armory. In February we will have an opportunity to view the Greek and Roman galleries at the Metropolitan with a very special tour of this new wing. We will also hear a lecture on fine Georgian revival buildings from the late 19th century to the present day in New York, Boston, and Philadelphia by Francis Morrone, noted architectural historian. An exhibit of Meissen porcelain will allow us to revisit the elegant Frick Collection in March, where we will have an exclusive tour of the show with a reception to follow. If you missed last season's lecture by Wendell Garrett on Georgian rakehells, be sure to sign up this year, when Mr. Garrett will be talking about Georgian Grace. In June we will visit Gracie Mansion, an architectural gem right in our own neighborhood. Trips farther afield are planned to Winterthur and nearby historic houses in May and to see the eighteenth-century houses of Newport in the fall. The visit to Newport will be our first jointly organized trip with the Georgian Group in the U.S. Other upcoming events include a lecture on the great houses of New York and a tour of the Metropolitan's collection of Georgian paintings. We are also looking forward to our trip to Gloucestershire in October.

You will all be aware by now that we moved our offices this past year. Our new address is above and we have a new telephone number and e-mail address as well. Our web site, www.americangeorgians.org,


