Matthew Webster told us about a number of eighteenth-century houses, such as Drayton Hall and Kenmore, and the construction methods used at the time. We were joined by several members of the Harvard Club for a lecture there by Winthrop Aldrich on preservation efforts in New York State. The techniques of reproducing Georgian-era mantles and fireplaces were demonstrated when we visited Chesney's wonderful showroom. Giles Waterfield gave us a glimpse of the private life of George IV and Oliver Bradbury gave a very interesting talk on the Lost Houses of Mayfair at the Union Club. 

He has written and lectured extensively in the United States and abroad about historic British houses and is creator of the award-winning database www.DiCamilloCompanion.com, that is attempting to document every British and Irish country house ever built. His talk will focus on the Rothschild family's seven country houses, and on the influence of

other eighteenth-century families, such as the Spencers and the Bedfords, whose grand houses remain treasures of art and architecture.
