

## The Country Houses of Dorset Explored OCTOBER 17-21, 2011

Dorset, a county in the west of England, is full of legend and mystery, with colorful and ancient villages and important country houses and collections, inviting exploration. This tour begins the evening of October 16 with a candlelight reception in London in the elegant eighteenth-century Robert Adam rooms of the Georgian Group. We will depart the next morning for our luxurious hotel in the middle of Dorset. We stop en route for avisit to Trafalgar House, the nation's gift to the family of Admiral Lord Nelson, who famously defeated Napoleon at the battle of Trafalgar. We shall be visiting **Mapperton**, home of the Earl and Countess of Sandwich, where enchantment begins on approaching the sixteenth-century house with its procession of bay trees leading to the front door, which is guarded by a pair of eagles on the gate. The history of **Forde Abbey** reflects its transformation from a richly embellished medieval abbey to private ownership; a superb set of seventeenthcentury Mortlake tapestries still hang in the room for which they were ordered. Sherborne Castle was granted to Sir Walter Raleigh by Queen Elizabeth in 1592. Its turbulent history will be explored along with its richly furnished interior. We shall enjoy a gala dinner at Minterne with Lord and Lady Digby. These are just a few houses among the several we will visit each day; often their owners will show us around. Our guide throughout is Jeffrey Haworth, formerly a regional director with the National Trust; he has deep knowledge of all aspects of England's rich heritage and will accompany us as we visit the hidden corners and fascinating houses of Dorset, this most tranquil county of England.



Details and reservation information will be mailed shortly for the AFGG annual trip to England. In the meantime, save the date for this wonderful trip to the country houses of Dorset, October 17–21, 2011.
