Glorious Splendor: the 18th-Century Wallpapers in the Jeremiah Lee Mansion



The magnificent original wallpapers in the Jeremiah Lee Mansion in Marblehead, Massachusetts, were hand painted in the 1760s and, amazingly, survive today. Judy Anderson, former curator of the Lee Mansion, will discuss her book about the English mural papers and the block-printed wallpapers that decorate the Palladian house built in 1766-1768 for the wealthy ship owner Jeremiah Lee.

## Provincial Palladianism in Georgian America: Old World Dreams, New World Realities \*lecture and reception\* Wendell Garrett



The "aristocrats" of Colonial America established themselves in houses that reflected their owners' importance in the community and they built public buildings that followed the principles of classical architecture. AFGG

advisory board member Wendell Garrett, architectural historian and delightful lecturer, will tell us how the qualities exemplified by the Palladian style were translated to the New World and used to make social and economic statements. Buildings such as Monticello, in Virginia, and the Redwood Library, in Newport, were typical of this style.
