2016 will be an exciting year for the Georgian Group, as we have a full calendar. Hope to see you at the Lapicida showroom visit on February 25th.

Besides the October trip exploring the "Marches" border area between England and Wales, and staying at Weston Park (whose accommodations put Downton Abbey to shame), many private country estates will be visited as well as an afternoon to enjoy the town of Shrewsbury. 2016 is also the 300th birthday of Capability Brown, landscape architect to the 18th century "Stars." The Bradford Estate is one of his finest designs, and the grounds will be a feature of the visit.

This year we have a number of speakers from England. On April 21st, Julia King, who spoke last fall at the Georgian Group Adam's Symposium in London, will be discussing her recent book on George Hadfield, Federal City architect. Oliver Cox will discuss the country houses in the Thames Valley on May 12th - this is a co-sponsored talk with the Royal Oak. In June we will be visiting the Irvington, NY area, seeing some grand homes and lunching on the Hudson River. On September 22nd we are honored to be given a talk by Wolf Burchard, a new trustee of the Georgian Group. His talk will be based on the first two Georges' influence on the architecture and design in England during their reigns. ## George Hadfield: Architect of the Federal City

Dr. Julia King will be discussing her recent book *George Hadfield: Architect of the Federal City*. During his lifetime, the work of the neoclassical architect George Hadfield (1763-1826) was highly regarded, both in England and the United States.



Since his death, however, Hadfield's contributions to architecture have slowly faded from view, and few of his buildings survive. In order to reassess Hadfield's career and work, this talk draws upon a wide selection of written and visual sources to reconstruct his life and legacy. Projects include the Capitol, Arlington House and Old City Hall.



Dr. King is an art and architectural historian, whose degrees are from the Courtauld Institute, Brookes University and Birkbeck College, University of London. Dr. King has taught at universities in Great Britain and America. She has worked on projects in conservation, historic preservation, archives and architectural history on both sides of the Atlantic. Dr. King has written and lectured widely on art and architectural history in both countries.

## The Architectural Legacy of the Early Hanoverians Lecture and Reception Thursday, September 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6:00 pm Sotheby's Institute of Art 570 Lexington Avenue, 6<sup>th</sup> Fl. \$45 per person for AFGG members

This lecture, by Dr. Wolf Burchard will explore the little known architectural patronage of the first two Georgian monarchs. The Hanoverians had a great variety of palaces, castle and hunting lodges both in Britain and Germany. Whilst not as sumptuous as the palaces of

Versailles, Vienna or Berlin, the Georgian residences reflected the new monarchs' understanding of the differences between the British monarchy and the absolute ones on the continent.

Dr. Wolf Burchard is the Paul Mellon/Royal Oak Furniture Research Curator at the National Trust in London and a Trustee of the Georgian Group. He was Curatorial Assistant at the Royal Collection from 2009-2014 and co-curator of The First Georgians: Art & Monarchy, 1714-1760 (The Queen's Gallery, Buckingham Palace, 2014), which marked the tercentenary of the Hanoverian Succession.
